Key Vocabulary

Preparing: the act of getting ready.

Advent: means 'coming' and describes the 25 days before Christmas.

Christmas: the feast of the birth of Jesus Christ.

Nativity: the birth of Jesus which is celebrated at Christmas.

Waiting: to stay in the same place or not do something until something else happens.

Annunciation: the feast which celebrates the announcement by the angel Gabriel to Mary that she would have a Son to be called Jesus.

Visitation: the feast which celebrates when Mary went to visit her cousin Elizabeth who was pregnant with John the Baptist.
