




Jesus gave us a new rule...

Key Vocabulary

Home: a place where a person lives permanently as a member of a family and where someone feels safe and accepted.

Family: a group of people who are related to each other, especially parents and their children.

Difference: the way in which two things being compared are not the same.

Respect: a feeling or way of treating someone or thinking about them who you admire deeply.

Community: a group of people living in one particular area or a group of people who are considered a unit because of their common interests, social group or nationality.

Ephesians: People who lived in Ephesus.

Psalm: a prayer song.
