Key Vocabulary

Sacrament of Confirmation: When the person being confirmed renews the promises from their Baptism and receives the gift of the Holy Spirit via the Bishop.

Oil of Chrism: A special oil that signifies the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Mitre: a special headdress worn by the Bishop.

Sponsor: The person who represents the community into which the person being confirmed is being welcomed into.

Catechist: The person who instructs the person who is being confirmed.

Crozier: a staff which looks like a shepherd's crook carried by the Bishop.

Bishop: The leader of the Christians and the Christian priests in the Diocese.
