Key Vocabulary

Baptism: The special Sacrament in which a person is welcomed into God's family.

Water: symbolises cleansing and that Baptism is a new start in a life with Jesus.

Candle: symbolises that Jesus is the light of the world. We must shine like lights to others so that they recognise we are followers of Jesus

Family: we become a member of God's family when we are baptised.,

Priest: the person who is ordained and carries out the Baptism.

White garment: shows that we are clothed in Christ's love.

Godparents: they support us in our faith journey when we are bapised.

Font: the place in our church where water is poured over the baby's head.
