### **Key Vocabulary**

**Demands**: an insistent request.

**Visitor**: a person visiting someone or somewhere.

**Isaiah**: Isaiah is one of the most important Old Testament prophets, who predicted the birth of Jesus Christ.

**Messiah**: the promised "anointed one" or Christ; the Saviour. Christians believe that Jesus was the Messiah who delivered mankind from its sins.

**Advent**: the period beginning four Sundays before Christmas.

**Annunciation**: the announcement by the angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary that she would conceive a son by the power of the Holy Spirit to be called Jesus (Luke 1:26–38).

**The Visitation**: the visit, described in the Gospel According to Luke (1:39–56), made by the Virgin Mary, pregnant with the infant Jesus, to her cousin Elizabeth.

Magnificat: The Magnificat is the song that the Virgin Mary sang when she was told by the angel that she was going to give birth to God's son

**Joyful Mysteries**: The Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary are so called because they recount all the Joys of the "Good News", namely Jesus.
