Key Vocabulary

Community: a group of people living in the same place or who share something in common.

Parish: an area that has its own local church.

Laity: the ordinary people who are involved in the work of a church but who are not priests.

Ministry: performing a specific act on behalf of the Church eg giving communion or reading.

Extraordinary Ministers: a person who is authorised by the church to assist with giving Holy Communion.

Funeral rite: the service the Church performs at the burial of one of its members. It honours the person and entrusts him/her to God.

Pastoral area: the area looked after by a priest or a Bishop.

Deanery: a group of parishes led by a dean (a priest appointed by the Bishop).

Diocese: large group of Parishes led by a Bishop.
