Key Vocabulary

Eucharist: also known as the sacrament of Holy Communion. It is the part of the Mass during which the bread and wine are made holy and become the Body and Blood of Christ.

Eucharistic Prayer: The central part of the Liturgy of the Eucharist when the Last Supper is recalled and the bread and wine are consecrated.

Liturgy: a public act of worship which includes the celebration of Mass and the celebration of the Sacraments.

Consecration: to make something holy.

Chalice: a goblet or cup with a stem.

Paten: a plate, typically made of gold or silver used for holding the bread during the Eucharist.
