In his unit the children will learn that Pentecost is the 'Birth Day' of the church. It occurred 50 days after Easter Sunday or 50 days after Jesus rose from the dead. Jesus had already gone back to Heaven so the disciples and new believers of Jesus were waiting to receive the Holy Spirit because that's what Jesus told them would happen. Plus, since Jesus wasn't with them anymore the Holy Spirit would help bring them closer to God. People were gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate the Jewish Festival of Weeks (a harvest festival) when Pentecost took place.

Ascension: rising to a higher level.

Witnesses: the people who see an event take place.

Blessing: promising. something or someone to the care of God

Pentecost: The feast celebrating when the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples of Jesus.

Promise: a commitment by someone to do or not do something.

Good News: the news of the coming of the Kingdom of God.
