
Love one another.

Rules

In this unit we will learn that for Christians, the greatest commandment is to love God and to love one another. We will learn about making good choices and that when something bad is done on purpose that we know will hurt or upset someone, that it is called a 'sin'. A sin breaks our friendship with God and others and makes us feel bad. God always loves us, even when we sin. We will learn about the importance of saying sorry and we will find out about the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Key Vocabulary

- **Rule:** an instruction that tells you what you allowed to do and what you are not allowed to do.
- **Sorry:** to feel regret or bad about something you did.
- **Forgive:** to stop blaming or feeling angry or resentful towards someone for something they have done.
- **Right:** to make a good choice
- **Wrong:** to make a bad choice
- **Choice:** an act of choosing between two or more possibilities.
- **Sin:** the intention to do wrong deliberately.
- **Consequences:** the result of something especially a bad choice.
- **Examination of Conscience:** to examine your life.
- **Reconciliation:** to restore friendship with another person or God.
