- To recognise the signs and symbols used in Baptism and what they mean.
- To explore the key aspects of the Church through a visit with Fr Andrew.
- To conduct our own Baptisms through role play.
- To know that Baptism is an invitation to belong to the Church family.

Questions of Meaning and Purpose:

- How can I belong to God?
- What does it feel like to belong?
- How can we help others to feel they belong?

Key Vocabulary

Candle: symbolises that Jesus is the light of the world. We must shine like lights to others so that they recognise we are followers of Jesus

Water: symbolises cleansing and that Baptism is a new start in a life with Jesus.

Chrism: a special oil that was used to anoint important people like priests, prophets and kings. We are also very special when we are baptised.

White Garment: shows that we are clothed in Christ.

Godparents: they support us in our faith journey when we are bapised.

Jesus: the Son of God who was born to Mary and Joseph who were his human family on earth.
