


# UNITED KINGDOM - MAPWORK



Key vocabulary	Definition
United Kingdom	England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
Great Britain	England, Scotland and Wales.
Natural	Made by the earth.
Man-made	Made by human beings.
Climate	What the weather is like in a place over a long period. Includes things like temperature, rainfall, wind.
Ordnance Survey	An agency that is responsible for mapping Great Britain.
Symbol	A simple image, letter or number to represent something on a map.
Greenwich	A borough in London containing the Royal Observatory and the site of the Meridian Line.
Topographic map	Shows the shape of the earth.
Compass	A tool used for showing direction.
Scale	A way to show the actual size of something compared to a model or image.
Lines of Latitude	To find out how far north or south a place is, lines of latitude are used. These lines run parallel to the Equator.
Lines of Longitude	To find out how far east or west a place is, lines of longitude are used. These lines run from the top of the Earth to the bottom.
