Art - Collage

Children will develop their art skills by learning about and making their own collages. Children will learn that a collage is a great way to explore their creativity and design skills. Collages are a piece of art created by putting together different materials and textures.

Key Knowledge

- To respond to the work of Henri Matisse and investigate negative and positive images.
- To develop cutting and measuring skills in response to the work of Victor Vasarely.
- To investigate the work of Paul Klee and his use of complementary colours.
- To collaborate on a group piece of artwork.
- To identify what you would change in your work.

Key Vocabulary

Adapt - make something suitable for a new use or purpose; modify.

Complementary colours - pairs of colours that contrast with each other more than any other color, and when placed side by side make each other look brighter.

Direction - guidance of something or someone.

Horizontal - parallel to the plane of the horizon; at right angles to the vertical.

Modify - make partial or minor changes to something.

Optical illusion - something that deceives the eye by appearing to be other than it is.

Overlapping - extend over and cover partly.

Pathways - a track that serves as a path.

Vertical - at right angles to a horizontal plane.
