

Year 4 French: Summer 1

Feeling unwell / Jungle animals



In this module:

This half term Stage 2 learners will recap body parts from Spring 2 and use this to learn phrases to describe aches and pains.

The children will move on to learn nouns for jungle animals, and through a story will learn adjectives associated with the animals. The children will write simple descriptive sentences, then will have an opportunity to write a description of a dragon or a unicorn of their creation.

Through stories, games, native speaker clips and independent tasks, they will explore the following content, topics and language:

1a) I don't feel well

- Recall body part nouns
- Learn phrases for aches and pains (I have ____ ache)

1b) Walking through the jungle

- Learn nouns for jungle animals
- Follow story with adjectives to describe jungle animals
- Write sentences including nouns and adjectives in correct order
- Opportunity for themed dragon and unicorn lesson, learning nouns for body parts and putting together with adjectives to write description

Learning Objective for each lesson:

- 1) I can recall parts of the body
- 2) I can explain why I don't feel well or what hurts
- 3) I can understand and remember jungle animal nouns
- 4) I can understand adjectives to describe jungle animals
- 5) I can write a simple sentence to describe a jungle animal
- 6) I can understand and write simple phrases and sentences to describe a dragon or a unicorn

Adjectives agree with the noun they describe. The spelling of the same adjective can change if you are describing a masculine (le) noun or a feminine (la) noun.
