

Year 4 French: Summer 2

Going on a picnic



In this module:

This half term Stage 2 learners will be finding out all about the weather and ice creams. The children will start by learning weather phrases, play games to practise weather phrases and make a weather windows chart.

The children will move on to look at ice cream flavours, learn how to order an ice cream and create their perfect ice cream. There is an opportunity here for a special end of year lesson – having a real ice cream!

Through games, songs and independent tasks, they will explore the following content, topics and language:

2a) Weather

- Learn weather phrases and play games to practise the phrases
- Make a weather windows chart
- Look at typical weather in different parts of the world

2b) Ice creams

- Learn names of ice cream flavours
- Look at sounds in ice cream flavours
- Look at the language for ordering an ice cream
- Design own perfect ice cream creation
- Option to have an ice cream as end of year celebration

- 2) I can remember weather phrases
- 3) I can play games with weather phrases
- 4) I can say flavours of ice creams
- 5) I can pronounce flavours and spot sounds in the flavours

Asking for an ice cream phrase bank

Je voudrais – I would like

Une glace- an ice cream

Une glace au chocolat- a chocolate ice cream

Une glace au citron- a lemon ice cream

Une glace à la fraise- a strawberry ice cream

Une glace à la framboise- a raspberry ice cream

Une glace à la menthe- a mint ice cream

Une glace à la vanille- a vanilla ice cream

Grammar

Take a look at the flavours of the ice creams.

If we ask for a flavour of ice cream that is a masculine noun (le)
then we say **au chocolat/ au citron.**

If we ask for a flavour of ice cream that is a feminine noun (la)
then we say **à la fraise / à la menthe**
