Year 5 French: Autumn 2 Time in the city



During this half term the children will revisit and extend their knowledge of places in a town from Stage 2 Autumn 2. They will explore a French city (Paris or Bordeaux) and design a city of the future. Children will become tour guides, describing a real or imaginary city, and they will revisit asking politely for something in two new contexts: an entrance ticket for a city attraction, and a present in a shop.

Through songs, games, native speaker clips and independent tasks, they will explore the following content, topics and language:

2a - In the city

- Explore a city in France
- Look at nouns for places in a town or city, including shops
- Describe a city in the role of a tour guide
- Ask politely for a ticket

2b – Christmas shopping

- Learn and remember nouns for presents and favourite things
- Join in roleplay asking for a present in a shop, listening and responding to questions

Learning Objective for each lesson:

- 1) I can explore a city in France
- 2) I can design a city of the future
- I can understand and give simple information about a city
- I can ask for an entrance ticket politely in French
- I can understand and remember nouns for favourite things
- 6) I can ask politely for a gift in a shop

Avez vous....? Do you have...

Grammar

When we want to say "some" with an item in the plural, then we change "les" to "des". e.g.

les fleurs – the flowers des fleurs- some flowers
