
Year 5 French: Spring 2

Clothes, colours and fashion shows



This half term the children will be learning nouns for clothes with a fancy dress theme to reflect Carnival time. They will start by imagining fancy dress outfits and choose their favourite. The children will then learn the nouns for items of clothing, they will complete tasks and play games to familiarise with the nouns and spellings. The children will see how to use colours as adjectives and host an alien fashion show! To complete the unit the children will create their own outfit and write a description of their outfit.

Through songs, games, native speaker clips and independent tasks, they will explore the following content, topics and language:

- Carnival-themed fancy dress lesson
- Learn nouns for items of clothing
- Learn to describe clothing items using colours, and see how spellings of colours can change...
- Host an alien fashion show (reading descriptive sentences)
- Write a description of an outfit of their choosing

Grammar

The plural word for "the" in French is "les". When we want to say "some" with a plural noun we say and write "des".

Grammar

When we say and write colours as adjectives after the noun in French the spelling changes to match the noun and whether it is singular or plural and masculine or feminine.

e.g. le tshirt **blanc**/ les tshirts **blancs**la jupe **blanche**/les jupes **blanches**

The adjectives "grand" and petit" are said and written before the noun in French.
