Year 6 French: Spring 2 This is me, hobbies and fun



This half term, Stage 4 learners will be starting off with a funfair theme, looking at the names for rides in French, adjectives to describe the rides, a board game using the key language and an opportunity to write opinions about rides and funfairs.

After covering sports in Spring 1, Stage 4 learners will go on to look at favourite things, revisiting personal information and presenting themselves in writing and verbally to a partner. This is a great opportunity for dictionary work as the children can extend their opinions to new favourite things using a bilingual dictionary as a language tool.

Through games, native speaker clips and independent tasks, they will explore the following content, topics and language:

2a) All the fun of the fair

- Learn the nouns for rides in French
- Learn descriptions of rides and apply these appropriately
- Express opinions of rides and funfairs

2b) Favourites

- Recap personal information
- Listen to and show understanding of personal information and opinions of another person
- Use and apply that understanding to create their own spoken and written presentation
- Read, understand and adapt opinion sentences
- Assessment lesson

- I can give a simple description of a fairground ride
- I can present information about myself
- I can say and write sentences about myself
