

Year 6 French: Summer 1

Café culture and restaurants



In this module:

This half term, Stage 4 learners will be learning about the culture of going to cafes in France. They will start by learning the language for ordering food in a café, then use this in a café roleplay and record this on a triarama making activity. The children will perform their café roleplays in class.

Using their knowledge from the café roleplay, Stage 4 learners will go on to read, rehearse and perform a French comedy sketch set in a cafe. The children will conclude the unit with a story about the alien family in a restaurant, and if time, they can create their own fantastical menus.

Through games, native speaker clips and independent tasks, they will explore the following content, topics and language:

1) Café culture

- Learn about the culture of going to cafes in France
- Learn key vocabulary for food and phrases for ordering food in a café
- Play games to familiarise with café roleplay language and phrases
- Write and perform café roleplays
- Read and familiarise with comedy sketch set in a café
- Rehearsals and performances of café comedy sketch
- Follow a story in a restaurant setting
- Create own themed menus

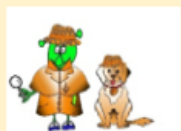
Learning Objective for each lesson:

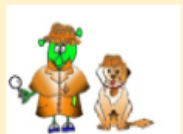
